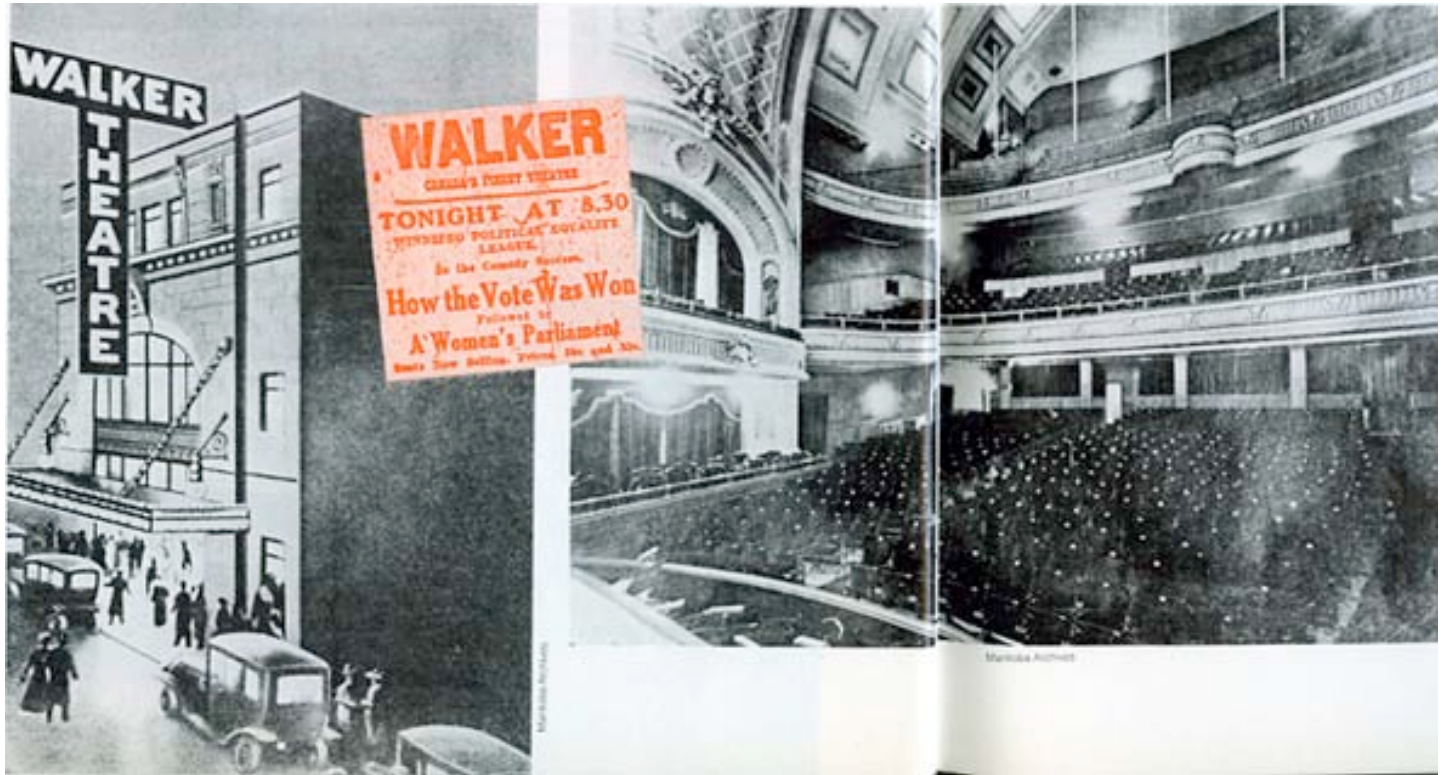

April 1916

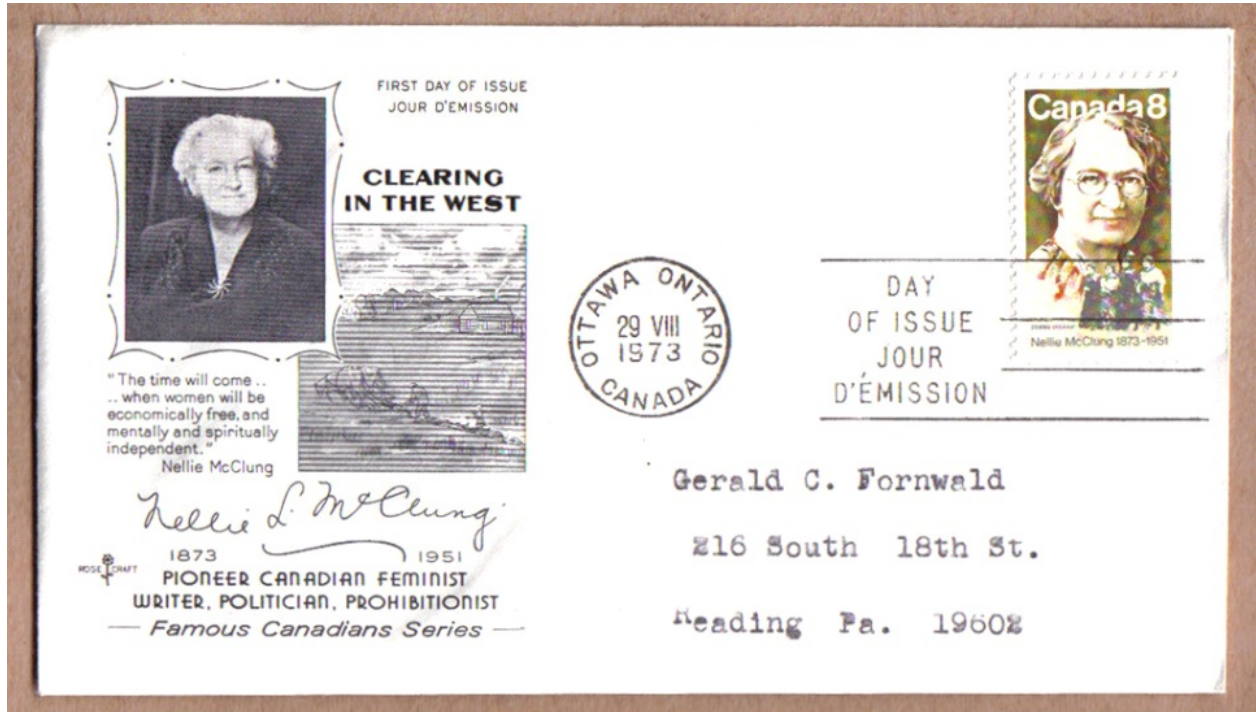

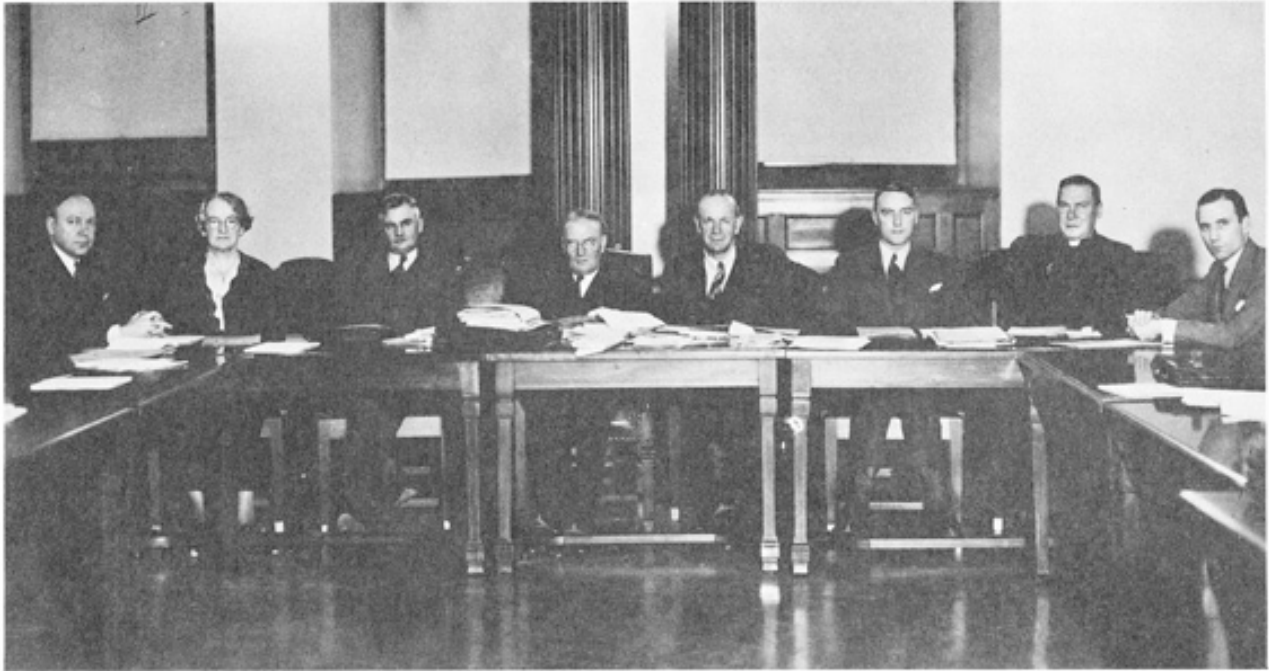
A Stamp Issued

First Board of Governors (1936-1942)

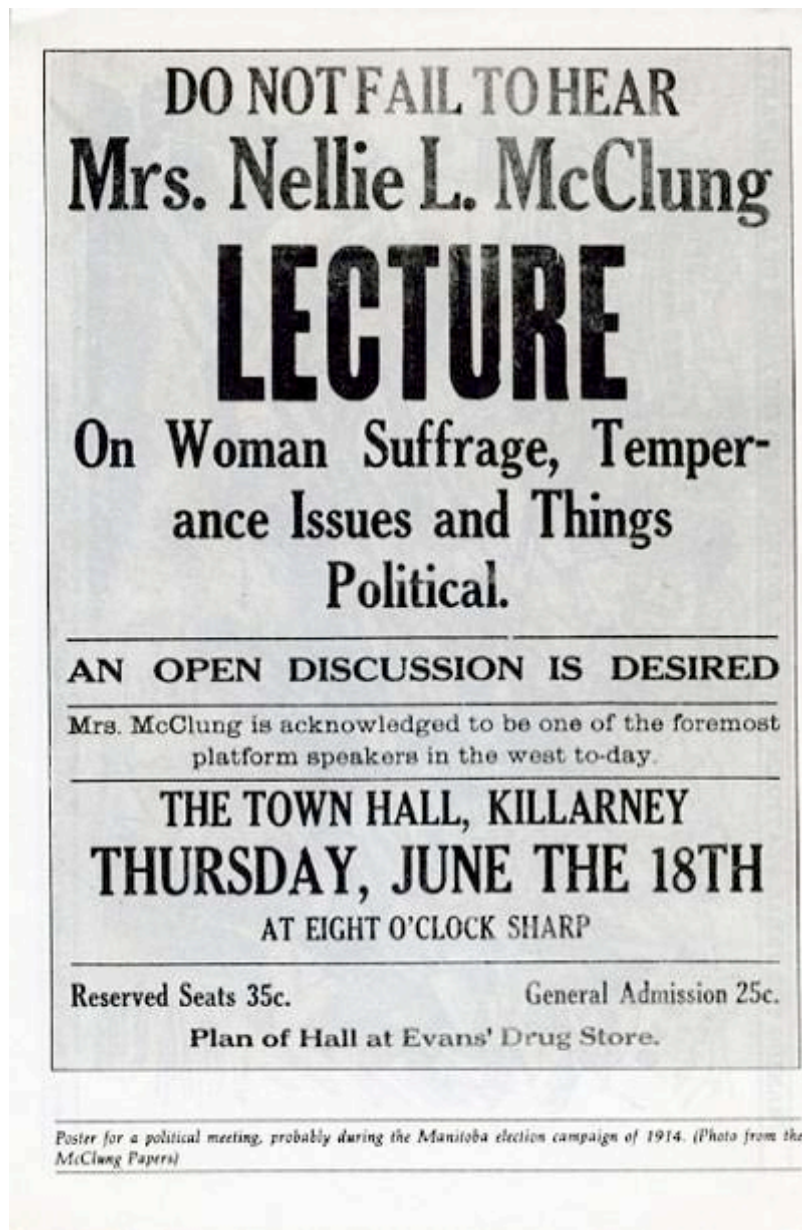


Taken on Nov. 3, 1936, other board members were: Leonard W. Brockington, K.C., Chairman; Rene Morin, Vice-Chairman; Wilfred Bovey, K.C., J. Wilfred Godfrey, N. L. Nathanson, Brig. Gen. Victor Odium, Alan Plaunt, Rev. Alexander Vachon.

In 1936, the Government of Canada appointed a new Board of Governors that had Canada wide responsibilities.

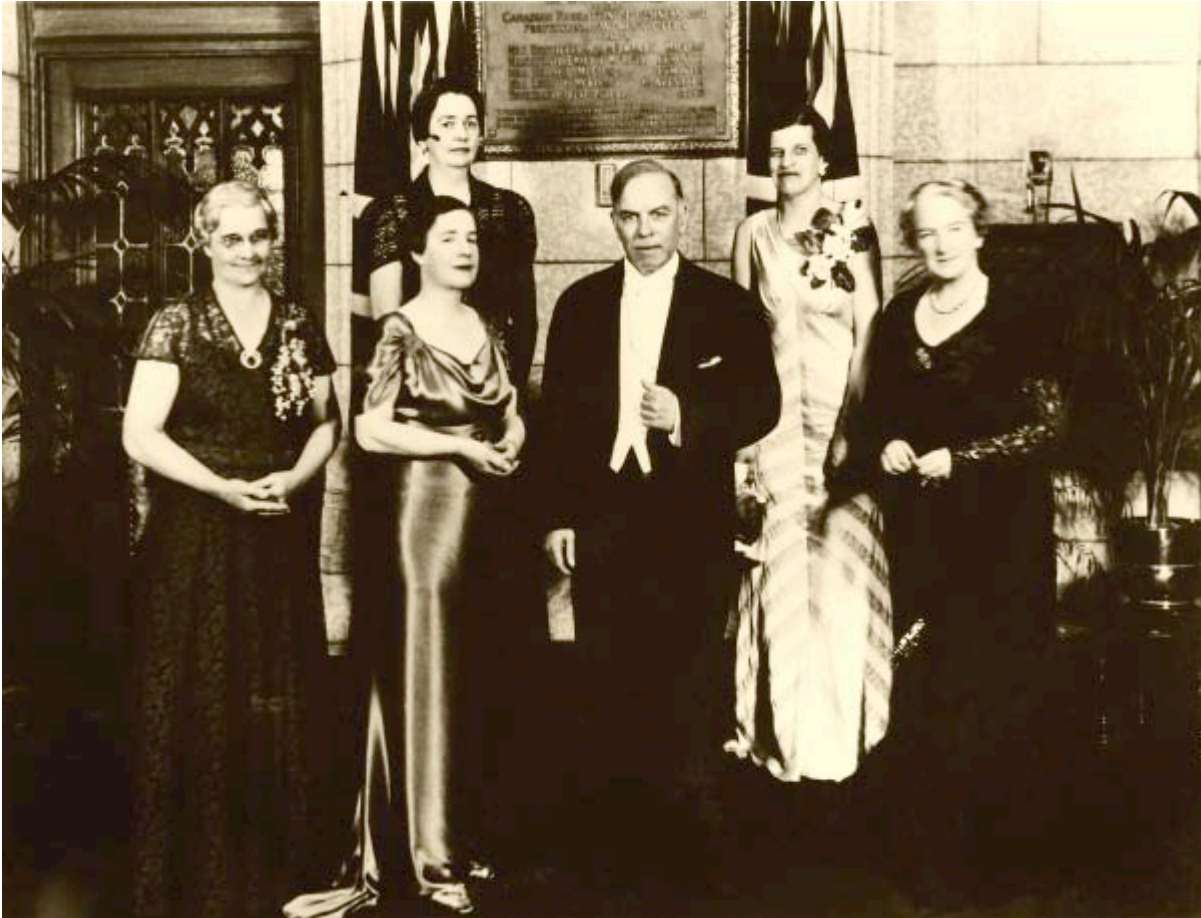
Nellie McClung, the only woman on the Board, can be seen sitting here with the other members.
